

Ladies Day 2022 Information package

Ladies day is every <u>Wednesday & Thursday</u>. The registration will be on a first come, first serve basis.

At time of registration, the Ladies Day registration form must be filled out and a \$20.00 registration fee paid before participating in Ladies Day competition. The registration fee is **non-refundable**.

No Shows

A "<u>No Show</u>" is a golfer who books a tee time and does not show up, or is late for their tee time. If a golfer does not plan to show up for a booked tee time we require a phone call to indicate this. If a golfer is going to be late for their tee time we require a phone call to attempt to accommodate this problem. In any case there is <u>no guarantee</u> we will be able to adjust tee times for you, however we will do our best.

Tee Box Position

As Ladies Night is a competition. All ladies **must hit from grass tee boxes** unless posted to hit off of the mats.

Tee Time Booking

The first Ladies Day will be Wednesday April 27, 2022 (weather permitting), and registered golfers can book their tee times starting April 20th. We will continue to book <u>one week</u> in advance, so each Wednesday you can book for the following week.

- Ladies Day is a **9 Hole Event**. The cost is \$27.00 for the nine holes, of which \$19.00 is for green fees and \$8.00 is held for weekly prizes.
- **Before 1:00pm,** Ladies can play 18 holes for \$34.00, but must start on the front or back nine as required that week.
- **After 3:00pm,** Ladies Day players have the right of way and if the volume of ladies dictates it the course will be closed to ladies only. If volume does **NOT** dictate it then other golfers will be allowed on the golf course.
- Golfers must play with other Ladies Day members ONLY.
- Ladies wanting to play 18 holes will only be able to if space and time is available, as Ladies will be teeing off both front and back nine.



- Normal procedures will apply as to filling out a foursome with other golfers as needed to best use available tee times.

Scoring and Course Rules

Ladies must record their total strokes for the hole (this includes strokes to get on the green and putts), <u>and</u> the number of putts you took in a separate line. If the golfer uses a putter from off the green it does <u>not</u> count as a putt.

All putts must be holed out and simply hitting the flagstick does not constitute as being holed out.

If you address the ball with the intent to hit it, and you miss hitting it, it is considered a stroke.

Each golfer must have and record their own score on their own scorecard. The scorecard must record the score on the nine holes you are playing. A common mistake to avoid is recording a score for the back nine as the front nine, and vise versa. It is **imperative** to give your scorecard to another golfer in your group to witness your score and sign the scorecard after the round. **Only** another Ladies Day golfer in your group can sign your scorecard, and each Lady can only sign one card.

A player is allowed relief from an embedded ball, with the ball placed no closer to the hole. A player is allowed one club length of relief no closer to the hole (or the nearest point of relief) from cart paths, wooden fences, or other manmade objects. Tee shots hit into the gullies on #2, #5, & #17. Use drop zone on other side and count a stroke.

Ladies Day Final Tournament

Ladies day finale will be held on Friday September 9th and Saturday September 10th, 2022. We will continue with the same format as in 2021. That being you will golf, hand in your score card then have your meal. Every lady will receive a prize that is randomly drawn and handed out prior to their round starting. The remaining draw prizes, along with results from the lady's finale golf, will be generated on Sunday September 11th. All winners will be notified of their winnings to pick up at the clubhouse. *Unlike our regular ladies' day which is a 9-hole event the final is based on 18 holes*.

Prizes (all Weekly Prizes will be cash prizes with exception of the weekly draws)



If you are a returning ladies day player and have played in at least three ladies' days you will have a handicap. This handicap carries forward from the previous year. If you did not play in the previous year. You will have to play three games to establish a handicap. **Handicaps from other golf courses <u>cannot</u> be used.**

<u>All</u> money must be collected prior to 4pm on September 10th, 2021 or it will be forfeited and be rolled into the yearend finale prize pool.

Prize money breakdown distribution is listed below.

- \$3.50 Weekly Prizes (low gross and net, KP's, LP's)
- \$1.00 Birdies
- \$.50 Weekly draw (\$10 Alder Hills Gift Certificates)
- \$1.00 Hole in one pot
- \$1.00 Year end draw (trip voucher's etc.)
- \$1.00 Final Tournament prizes
- \$8.00 Weekly prize total

Weekly Prizes

KP's – Closest to the Pin

Three KP's are awarded on the front and three on the back.

You must be on the green with your first shot to qualify for a KP.

LP's – Longest Putt

Three LP's are awarded on the front and three on the back.

Any putt sunk which is longer than any other Ladies Day golfer that day, qualifies for the longest putt. You must be on the green for the shot to be considered as a putt. Putting from off the green is not a putt.

Low Putts

One prize is awarded for each handicap flight.

During your nine holes keep track of how many putts you take on each hole. Putts taken from off the green are not recorded as putts.

Low Gross – Low Net

Prizes are awarded for the lowest gross and net scores per handicap fight.



Note: If you win low gross, you are not eligible for low net. If there is a tie, a count back would be done. Our Tournament Scoring software will determine the winner with its countback method.

Birdies

A Birdie on our course is a ball that is in the cup on the second stroke. The weekly birdie pot will be shared by dividing the pot by the number of birdies.

Weekly Draws

Each week randomly drawn names will be chosen to receive a \$ 10 Gift Certificate. Gift certificates can be used towards anything in the clubhouse except for prize money.

Hole in One Pot

The Hole-In-One Pot will be pro-rated. For example, if you get a Hole-In-One and you have played 5 of the 10 Ladies Days, you will receive 5/10ths of the pot, but if you played all 10 of the Ladies Day's, you qualify for the entire pot. **Note:** You must card the Hole-In-One on the nine holes that you are scoring for Ladies Day. You must also have the Hole-In-One witnessed by another Ladies Day participant in your group. If the Hole-In-One is on a hole with a KP, you do not receive the KP prize.

Any money remaining in the pot at year-end, week before the finale, will be used for prizes on the Ladies Day Final.

Please show up for your Tee Time at least 15 minutes early

If golfers arrive late we cannot guarantee that we can get them out to play. We will not jeopardize the pace of play to try and fit in late golfers.

Pace of Play

Slow play and delayed tee time are a source of tension and confrontation than can be easily avoided with proper consideration by all golfers. Keep up the pace of play (about seven minutes per hole) or let faster golfers play through. The procedure for a "play through" on our course is for the slower group to tee off first, and then let the faster group tee off before proceeding past the tee box area. Then the faster group and the slower group both leave the tee box area at the same time, but the faster group plays the hole out first. In this way the slower group does not fall behind as the next group approaches. Cooperation by both groups benefits both groups and it is a good day for golf.



<u>Note:</u> Prize money cannot be picked up any other day than <u>Wednesday and Thursday</u>. *All outstanding prizes must be picked up by the last Ladies Day, or the money will be added to the Final prize money.*
